

Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) Business Administration Emphasis in Logistics & Supply Chain Management (LSCM)

Degree Program

Coursework: 27 credit hours of Business & Research Foundation courses, nine hours in a Support Field in business administration, 24 hours of required courses in Logistics & Supply Chain Management (LSCM), and nine hours of approved LSCM electives.

Comprehensive Examination: Taken in LSCM and in a supporting field of the student's choice upon completion of coursework. Upon successful completion, student is advanced to candidacy.

Dissertation: Minimum of six credit hours; requires a proposal and an oral defense. Proposal must be defended within one year of advancement to candidacy, and the dissertation defended within three years of approval of the proposal.

Other Requirements: Teaching at least two courses, presenting a scholarly paper, and submitting a paper for publishing are required of all students. Please see the program website for all requirements.

Application Requirements

1. Application: <http://www.umsl.edu/gradschool/prospective/apply-now.html>
2. Three letters of recommendation
 - a. Letters that address academic potential must be provided by individuals who can accurately assess it such as previous instructors, professors, etc. At least two letters should be from individuals with earned doctorates
3. Official transcripts from all universities attended
 - a. Successful applicants must have completed at least a baccalaureate degree before beginning the program.
4. Entrance examinations
 - a. Acceptable official scores on Graduate Management Admission Test <http://www.mba.com/us> or Graduate Record Examination (<http://www.gre.org/ttindex.html>).
 - b. International students are required to document English proficiency by providing scores from an internationally accepted standardized examination before a decision is made on admission.
5. Grade Point Average
 - a. Minimum of 3.0 on 4.0 scale.
6. Statement of purpose
 - a. One or two page rationale for pursuing the Ph.D. in Business/LSCM.

\$50 for domestic applicants; \$40 for international applicants

Assistantships
